SEPTEMBER HIGHLIGHT: JOHANNESBURG ART FAIR

We attended the 18th edition of FNB Art Joburg, held in Johannesburg from 5–7 September. As the continent's leading and longest-running contemporary African art fair, FNB Art Joburg has spent 17 years championing African and diasporic artists. Widely regarded as the commercial and cultural heartbeat of contemporary African art, the fair continues to drive collector development, institutional engagement and innovation across the sector. FNB Johannesburg Art Fair got a fresh new look this year - the flow was smooth, the artworks easy to take in, and the mix of ideas truly inspiring. From intricate miniatures to bold installations, we spotted some incredible new talent to keep an eye on.

This year's edition featured seven curated sections, blending curatorial excellence with commercial opportunity:

- Gallery HUB The fair's core, showcasing the best in contemporary African art from across the continent and beyond.
- Gallery LAB An incubator for emerging galleries and hybrid spaces testing new ideas and models.
- MAX Large-scale and experimental works that challenge traditional booth formats.
- GIF Spotlight on photography within participating galleries' programmes.
- ETC Books, prints, catalogues and zines from master printers and publishers.
- ORG A reimagining of how audiences engage with Johannesburg's seminal art institutions.
- AUX Talks, screenings and public programmes sponsored by ITOO ArtInsure, featuring leading voices on contemporary art.

Beyond the three-day fair, FNB Art Joburg extends its reach through ArtJoburg.com, the BMW Young Collectors Co. and Open City, reinforcing its year-round commitment to education, access and audience development.



A LANDMARK MOMENT AT FNB ART JOBURG: SANTU MOFOKENG'S CONCERT AT SEWEFONTEIN

This year's FNB Art Joburg marked a milestone in South African photography with the first full public showing of *Concert at Sewefontein* by the late Santu Mofokeng (1956–2020). Long known for a single iconic image, the series is now revealed as 17 photographs capturing a 1988 concert organised by labour tenants on a Bloemhof farm. The work offers a rare glimpse of music, movement and community during apartheid, showing moments of joy and self-expression away from daily hardship.

Mofokeng, a protégé of David Goldblatt and a member of the Afrapix collective, later joined the University of the Witwatersrand's African Studies Institute. There, he deepened his research and refined seminal projects such as *Black Photo Album/Look at Me: 1890–1950*, reshaping how South African histories are seen. We still see his legacy reflected in the works of Lindokuhle Sobekwa and Jabulani Dhlamini.

Concert at Sewefontein underscores Mofokeng's legacy as a photographer who combined empathy and critique to transform overlooked stories into powerful visual histories about community, identity and power.

"Many who live in places like the sleepy tenant labour community of Bloemhof imagine a better life elsewhere, without the endless toil and drudgery of farm life. Rarely do they get to put their talent on display. Sewefontein is the place to be for anyone who's worth his or her salt. Here people are offered the chance to sing or perform—or do both. Out of the purview of employers and minders they are free to frolic, mate or get drunk, according to their wish or inclination. It is on weekends like this that shebeens thrive."

Artist highlight: Banele Khoza

Across the art world we're seeing a quiet but powerful change: artists moving away from overt politics and deconstruction toward intimacy, vulnerability and the poetry of everyday life

At this year's FNB Johannesburg Art Fair, Banele Khoza (Goodman Gallery) stood out with tender paintings of a toothbrush, a set of keys and the thrill of owning a car. These small domestic details, rendered with luminous brushwork, become symbols of dignity and self-acceptance.

It's a reminder that art doesn't always need to be loud to be meaningful. In these quieter gestures, we discover honesty, beauty and the grace of daily living.

Exhibition Highlight: Kamyar Binestarigh's Group Show at Shouthern Guild Gallery, Cape Town



Kamyar Bineshtarigh's *Group Show* at Southern Guild Cape Town is Bineshtarigh's second solo exhibition with the gallery and marks a refinement of his signature surface transfer technique, which lifts paint, plaster, dirt and incidental marks from artists' studios to preserve the traces of creative labour and human connections embedded in the making of art.

Group Show is on view at Southern Guild Cape Town until 10 November 2025, offering a rare glimpse into the intimate, lived-in spaces where South African art is created.
